Students will learn strategies and techniques for success in the agricultural journalism major and college courses generally using a systems thinking approach, fundamental concepts of communication information related to science, agriculture and natural resources to internal and external audiences, and complete a job shadowing experience to help prepare them for careers in the field.	4/26/13

Open only to College of Agricultural Sciences and Natural Resources (CASNR) students, and to School of Natural Resources students by consent of instructor(s).  Concepts and techniques related to use of remote and automated digital camera technology to capture images in agriculture and natural resources contexts to communicate a narrative/story. Students will complete an individual course project using a variety of technologies including camera traps, time-lapse camera systems, remote triggered cameras, as well as traditional audio and video and conventional photography.	4/26/13		

ALEC 475 - Communicating Strategic Discussions for Nebraska	New Course 475. Communicating Strategic Discussions for Nebraska (3 cr, 3 cr per sem, max 3, II) Lec 3. This course focuses on agricultural and natural resources related challenges faced by the state of Nebraska, as well as national and global food, fuel, and water issues. Students research, write, edit, and produce stories for publication (print and multimedia) in the annual Strategic Discussions for Nebraska magazine.
